








October is Cybersecurity Awareness Month: Stay Smart, Stay Safe



Every October, Cybersecurity Awareness Month reminds us that protecting our digital lives is a shared responsibility. With cyber threats evolving faster than ever, now is the time to sharpen your defenses and stay ahead of the scammers.

A few simple actions can dramatically reduce your risk online:

• Use Strong, Unique Passwords

Combine uppercase, lowercase, numbers, and symbols. Better yet, use a password manager to keep track of them all.

• Enable Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA)

MFA adds an extra layer of security – like a code sent to your phone – making it much harder for attackers to access your accounts.

• Update Software Regularly

Outdated apps and systems are prime targets. Turn on automatic updates or check manually every week.

• Recognize and Report Phishing

Be wary of emails or texts asking for personal info. If something feels off, don't click – report it and delete.

Cybercriminals are getting creative. Here are some of the top scams making the rounds:

• AI-Driven Phishing

Scammers now use AI to craft convincing emails that mimic real colleagues or services. Always verify before clicking.

• Smishing (SMS Phishing)

Text messages claiming to be from banks, delivery services, or government agencies that may contain malicious links.

QR Code Scams

QR codes in public places or emails can lead to fake websites. Only scan codes from trusted sources.

• Deepfake Impersonations

Video or voice messages that sound like your boss or a family member may be fake. Confirm through another channel before acting.



Security isn't just a tool—it's a mindset. Stay curious, stay cautious, stay empowered.



- **Real-Time Alerts:** ECU automatically sends text, phone, or email alerts if suspicious activity is detected on your debit or credit card.
- **Simple Response:** You'll be asked to reply "Yes" or "No" to confirm whether the transaction was yours.
- No Sensitive Info Requests: ECU CU will never ask for your account number, PIN, passwords, or verification codes via text.
- **Opt-Out Option:** If you prefer not to receive these alerts, you can reply "STOP" to any fraud alert message.

If you ever receive a message that feels off – especially one asking for sensitive info – **do not respond**. Instead, call ECU Credit Union directly at **727.471.1330** to verify its legitimacy.
